






















THE MAKANDA PROJECT

The Makanda Project was started in 2005 to explore the previously unrecorded compositions of Makanda Ken McIntyre (1931–2001). Dr. McIntyre, a Boston native, was an innovative but under-recognized multi-instrumentalist, composer, and educator. As a composer, he had a distinctive voice and a unique gift for doing unexpected things in very musical ways. He recorded 75 of his compositions, and upon his passing another 350 were found that had not been recorded or, in most cases, performed in public. Makanda Project leader and pianist John Kordalewski, a former McIntyre student, has arranged over 60 of these pieces for the group's 10-member horn section, and this music is the core of the group's repertoire.

Given that there is no record of Dr. McIntyre having performed these compositions, the Makanda Project differs from "tribute bands" whose performances are inevitably compared with original recordings. Rather, McIntyre compositions have served as a vehicle for the group to develop its own sound and identity.

The Makanda Project has established a presence on the Boston jazz scene through their ongoing series of self-produced free concerts in the Nubian Square and John Eliot Square neighborhoods of Roxbury. These concerts have taken place each year since 2006. In an era when opportunities to hear live jazz have decreased, the group believes that community-oriented events in accessible public locations are a most effective way to make the music available to the public.

CHICO FREEMAN

Chico Freeman, heralded as one of the most important saxophonists of our time, first learned jazz from his father, NEA Jazz Master saxophonist Von Freeman. After arriving in New York from Chicago in 1977, he began working with innovators such as McCoy Tyner, Elvin Jones, Art Blakey, Don Pullen, Sam Rivers, and Jack DeJohnette. In the late '70s and early '80s, Freeman also recorded prolifically as a leader, including classics such as *Spirit Sensitive* and *Kings of Mali* for India Navigation and *Peaceful Heart, Gentle Spirit* for Contemporary. In the mid-'80s, he formed The Leaders, an all-star sextet of internationally recognized bandleaders, which toured and recorded extensively. He was also a member of Roots, with saxophonists Nathan Davis, Benny Golson, and Arthur Blythe. In the early 2000s, with dozens of recordings as a leader to his credit, Freeman moved to Europe, where he lives and works today.

Besides his many accomplishments in jazz, Freeman has also performed with Latin greats such as Tito Puente, Machito, Irakere, and Eddie Palmieri, as well as with blues and R&B icons, including Memphis Slim, The Temptations, Jackie Wilson, and The Isley Brothers.

Once celebrated as a "young lion," Chico Freeman can now be called a "master musician."
